Day 1 Arrival to Sagres Transfer from Faro to Sagres (optional)

Day 2 Cycle from Sagres to Lagos 45Km +651m

Moving on, the idyllic Praia da Luz awaits you, offering not only a picturesque beach but also a gastronomic paradise. Ponta da Piedade appears as the next highlight, with notable rock formations and panoramic views. As dusk descends, your narrative culminates in the captivating city of Lagos. Here, the convergence between history and culture becomes palpable as you navigate ancient walls and traverse cobblestone streets. Discover the stories recorded in monuments such as the Church of Santo António and the iconic Forte da Ponta da Bandeira. The day ends with an immersion in the vibrant pulse of Lagos, where local cuisine is savored in an environment that comes to life at dusk. Day 3 Cycle from Lagos to Vale Fuzeiros 63Km 797m

Start your day with a visit to the expansive Meia Praia, where vast stretches of pristine sand create an idyllic coastal landscape. Head to Silves, a historic gem nestled in the hills of the Algarve, breathes a rich cultural heritage that echoes through its cobbled streets and majestic monuments. This enchanting city, once the capital of the Muslim Algarve, exudes a magical atmosphere, where the walls of Silves Castle whisper secrets of past battles and lost loves. Strolling through the narrow alleys of the historic center is like stepping back in time, with its whitewashed houses adorned with colorful flowers and wrought iron balconies. Between the soft sounds of fado and the tempting aroma of Algarve cuisine, visitors find an irresistible invitation to explore every corner of this enchanting city. One cannot talk about Silves without mentioning its impressive Gothic cathedral, an architectural masterpiece that bears witness to centuries of history and faith. And for culture lovers, the Municipal Archeology Museum offers a fascinating journey into the past, revealing the archaeological treasures that tell the fascinating history of this region. Silves is more than just a city; It is a cultural treasure that invites travelers to get lost in its ancient streets and discover the secrets it holds. Day 4 Cycle from Vale Fuzeiros to Cortelha (Barranco do Velho) 46Km 812m

Alte, where Fonte Grande stands out, an emblematic meeting point where locals gather to enjoy moments of conviviality and contemplation. With its cool waters shaded by ancient plane trees, the fountain is a refreshing refuge on hot summer days. Additionally, Alte is known for preserving its cultural traditions, with folk festivals and events celebrating the region's rich heritage. Visitors can experience authentic Algarve cuisine in local restaurants, where traditional dishes are prepared with fresh ingredients and unique flavors. Pena da Rocha is a fascinating point of interest for nature and geology lovers. In addition to its natural beauty, Pena da Rocha also attracts adventurers and climbers, who venture to climb to the top to enjoy a unique view over the Algarve coastline and the Atlantic Ocean. For those who prefer to explore on dry land, hiking trails around the area provide an opportunity to appreciate the local flora and fauna, including rare species of plants and birds. Day 5 Cycle from Cortelha to Alcoutim 72Km 667m

Cachopo is a picturesque village located in the interior of the Algarve, one of the most notable points of interest is its stunning landscape, characterized by green hills, deep valleys and crystal clear streams. This area is a paradise for nature lovers, just follow your course to discover hidden corners and stunning panoramic views. Explore the village center, with its narrow streets and whitewashed houses, and discover local shops selling artisanal goods such as pottery, textiles and basketry. Still in the interior of the Algarve. Martinlongo is another small village, surrounded by a serene, mountainous rural landscape, known for its tranquil atmosphere and authenticity. When you reach your destiny, Alcoutim, you will find a cultural treasure on the banks of the Guadiana River. With its narrow cobblestone streets and whitewashed houses, this village breathes history and authenticity. The imposing Castle stands out, offering stunning views of the surrounding countryside and dating back to Arab times. Additionally, you can explore the Main church of Nossa Senhora da Conceição, with its distinctive architecture and rich religious history. Alcoutim is also known for its cultural festivals, where traditional Algarve music, dance and gastronomy are highlighted. In short, Alcoutim is an unmissable destination for culture and history lovers, who want to immerse themselves in the authentic essence of the Algarve.



Day 6 Cycle from Alcoutim to Vila Real St. António 43Km 553m

While exiting Alcoutim, enjoy the Guadiana River, meandering alongside the village, is a source of life and inspiration, providing opportunities for activities such as boat trips and wildlife viewing. Castro Marim, is a work of cultural art that reflects the tradition and spirit of the region. This impressive structure, often decorated with religious motifs and traditional symbols, is an important part of local festivals and celebrations. The village not only serves as a focal point for cultural events, but also as a living expression of the identity and pride of the Algarve community. It is a symbol of connection to ancient traditions and a beacon of unity for residents and visitors who wish to celebrate the rich culture of the Algarve. Vila Real de Santo António, located in the southeast, is a city rich in history and culture. Founded in the 18th century, this town is known for its neoclassical architecture and orderly streets, designed according to a unique urban plan. The Marquês de Pombal main square stands out, with its historic buildings and the Municipal Market, where local flavors and colors meet.
